Report on Distribution of Food and Non-Food Items to Drought Displaced Persons from Wajir County on International Women's Day 2023



March 8, 2023 (International Women's Day)

Introduction:

This report outlines the distribution of food and non-food items (NFI) to drought-displaced persons, specifically focusing on activities carried out on International Women's Day 2023 in Garissa. The distribution aimed to provide essential assistance to vulnerable individuals and families affected by the ongoing drought, with a particular emphasis on recognizing and supporting women's needs and contributions. The event was organized through the EITWG led by the county government of Garissa in collaboration with NGEC Garissa regional office.

Objective:

- 1. Provide immediate relief to drought-displaced persons by distributing food and non-food items.
- 2. Highlight the specific challenges faced by women in the displacement situation and address their unique needs.
- 3. Empower women and promote gender equality through targeted interventions on International Women's Day.

Distribution Process:

Needs Assessment: Prior to the distribution, a comprehensive needs assessment was conducted to identify the most pressing requirements of the drought-displaced persons, with a focus on women and their families.

Stakeholder Coordination: Multiple stakeholders were involved in the distribution process, including government agencies, humanitarian organizations, community leaders, and volunteers among the key organizations that donated food and nonfood items include county government of Garissa, UNICEF, save the children, Terres De Hommes, National Drought Management Authority and Kenya Red cross

Procurement and Preparation: Food items, such as grains, pulses, cooking oil, and nutritional supplements, were procured and packaged. Non-food items, including hygiene kits, blankets, and cooking utensils, were also prepared.

Distribution Sites: Distribution sites were set up in accessible locations within the affected communities to facilitate the smooth distribution process.

Registration and Verification: Beneficiary registration and verification processes were implemented to ensure fair and targeted assistance.

Gender-Sensitive Approach: Gender considerations were incorporated throughout the distribution process, recognizing and addressing the specific needs and vulnerabilities of women and girls.

Community Engagement: Community members, including women's groups and local leaders, were actively involved in the distribution process to promote community ownership and ensure inclusivity.

Activities on International Women's Day:

Awareness and Advocacy: Various awareness activities were conducted to highlight the importance of gender equality, women's rights, and the empowerment of women in displacement situations.
